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*repeal date of the provision establishing the board and the board's authority to appoint an executive officer until January 1, 2024.*

SB339, Jones. An act to amend Section 8776 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to professions and vocations. *This bill would require a licensee who has direct knowledge of the occurrence of any of the specified events either by or against any other licensee to report the occurrence to the board. By imposing a new requirement on licensees, the violation of which would be a crime, this bill would impose a state-mandate local program.*
